

Proclamation from the Town of Rolesville

Recognizing Arbor Day 2016

WHEREAS in 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and

WHEREAS this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska; and

WHEREAS Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world; and

WHEREAS trees can reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce life-giving oxygen, and provide habitat for wildlife; and

WHEREAS trees are a renewable resource giving us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires and countless other wood products; and

WHEREAS trees in our town increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community; and


WHEREAS trees, wherever they are planted, are a source of joy and spiritual renewal.
